We offer this report as a heart-felt thank you for all that has been given, and as an open invitation for those who are passionate about southeast Kansas to become involved with the Community Foundation of Southeast Kansas (CFSEK.) As a regional philanthropic leader, we take great pride in our work in preserving the charitable legacy of our donors and in providing support to our nonprofit agencies. As is typical with most annual messages, we are sharing with you a few of the "numbers" that go along with our work. As of the end of 2009, CFSEK managed \$6.7 million in assets of which approximately 75% were endowed funds. A portion of the gifts received were used to relocate The Family Resource Center, an outstanding nonprofit organization serving children and families in our region, to their new location. Additionally, CFSEK received a large bequest from the Rosalie Manley estate of which a percentage of the gift will be utilized annually to provide for unrestricted grant making in the southeast Kansas region.

We are grateful for a knowledgeable and committed board of trustees who have devoted countless hours to our success. Our trustees are focused on building long term sustainability both for the CFSEK and for the nonprofits who serve our region.

In closing, the CFSEK strives to help more southeast Kansas residents better understand how a community foundation works and the potential benefits the foundation has for them, their communities and the nonprofits/charities they love and support. 

2009 General and Nutrition/Physical Activity GRANTS AWARDED

Partnership for All Cherokee County Children: To support HEET (Home Energy Efficiency Training), educational classes focused on energy conservation, weatherization, and budgeting, as well as a county-wide chili feed to raise funds to provide continued utility assistance support for families of Cherokee County.

Bourbon County Inter-Agency Coalition: To support the Network for Families Fund that provides utility assistance for low-income families with children in Bourbon County.

Catholic Charities: To support the Southeast Kansas Emergency Services Program. This program provides direct financial assistance (up to \$100 per family) to prevent eviction, loss of utilities, gas vouchers, and/or vital medications.

Christ's Community Church: To support the Food Box Ministry, a program that provides boxes of food for families in an emergency situation. Each box will provide 4-5 meals for the family.

Salvation Army: To support a pilot program: Freed-Up Financial Planning. This program will work to educate approximately 25 citizens in ways of gaining and retaining employment, how-to plan and implement strategies for handling personal finances which will lead to self-sufficiency.

Wesley House: To support the Children's Summer Food Program that provides a sack of food per child per week during the summer, to assist low-income families in Crawford County.

Class LTD: To fund "Fall into Habits," an two event-program created with a partnership with PACE to support healthy nutritional and physical activity choices. Both events will be open to approximately 400 individuals with intellectual disabilities, their families or guardians, and all Class LTD staff and their families. These programs will be in addition to the health and wellness program funded by CFSEK in 2008, which has become a part of Class LTD's current operating budget.

USD 508 – Baxter Springs: To support a Community Cardio Circuit Fitness Class that will be held on USD 508 school grounds for faculty and community members. This funding will help to purchase equipment to support what has been a volunteer program in the past, and to help recruit new attendees.

1st Christian Church, Columbus: To help support the implementation of a Summer Recreation Program for approximately 35-50 children in Kindergarten through 6th grade in Cherokee County. Funds will be used to help create needs-based tuition assistance, and to offset transportation expenses to local activities.

USD 404 – Riverton: To help support, "NPA is not for Chickens!" a nutrition and physical activity based program which will be open to students, faculty, staff, and community members of the Riverton school district. The program will hold regular meetings and will use school time for NPA education and practices and is a continuation of the Walk off the Weight program funded by the CFSEK in 2007.

The Learning Tree: To fund the continued development of NPA programs by the Visioning a Healthier Bourbon County Committee in Bourbon County through Family Nights at local Community Center and Schools promoting available physical activity opportunities. Events will be held in Fort Scott and Uniontown, and will be open to the public.

City of Parsons: To provide matching funds to the City of Pittsburg for the continued implementation of their "Workplace Wellness" program which assists City employees and their families through Health Fairs, Family Nights, a Weight Maintenance Program, and Company Olympics. This program will be open to the 125 City employees and their families.

Crawford County Restorative Justice: To support the "Little Changes Count" program that will incorporate nutritional education into their On the Right Track Program. This program serves approximately 15 at-risk youth to develop better decision-making skills.

Pittsburg Public Library: To fund "We Got to Move!" This program will introduce physical activity to library patrons through the use of a Wii gaming system, and will incorporate the promotion of positive nutritional choices.

KIDS First Daycare: To support the continued development of "A Family Affair," a program that extends the NPA education from the pre-school classroom to the families of the 61 children served in Crawford County. This is a continuation of the NPA program that has been in place and supported by the CFSEK since 2007.

Pittsburg Family YMCA: To support the expansion of their "Youth Moves" class. The class will be expanded through the addition of activities that promote positive nutritional choices. CFSEK funds will help to purchase materials needed to begin the nutritional activities, as well as scholarship assistance to offer the class to more youth in Crawford County. This class is for boys and girls between the ages of 8 and 12.

Pittsburg State University Free Clinic: To fund the production of nutrition and physical activity pamphlets to the clients of the Free Clinic, hosted by the Wesley House in Pittsburg.

Southeast Kansas Education Service Center: To support the "Growing Up Healthy Community Garden Project" for children, adults, and community members of Crawford County. Funds will help purchase supplies for the creation of a community garden which will share produce with Greenbush staff, local low-income families, as well as students enrolled in summer classes at Greenbush.

Mother to Mother Ministry: To support the "Reflecting on Nutrition and Physical Activities" program. The program will hold monthly meetings to educate economically disadvantages mothers how to make affordable nutritional choices for the families, and will provide low-cost opportunities for physical activities. All participants will be required to set and meet NPA goals as a part of their participation in the program.

Big Brothers Big Sisters of Crawford County: for the Get Fit Triathlon which encourages volunteers and the children they mentor to pursue healthier lifestyles.

First Christian Church: to provide tools, vegetable seeds, and supplies for the support of the Pittsburg Community Garden whose main focus is providing fresh produce to the Wesley House.

Ozark Trails Council (Boy Scouts of America): for the Scouting for Food program of which scouts collect 10,000 lbs of food to be given to local food pantries in Crawford County.

Elm Acres Foundation: for the Treatment Works! Program which provides for substance abuse treatment

Making an Impact MANLEY ESTATE GIFT

The CFSEK received a gift of \$552,419.52 on Friday, November 13th 2009 from the Rosalie D. Manley Trust. It marks the largest estate gift left to the CFSEK to date.

Manley, of Pittsburg, named the CFSEK as the Remainder Beneficiary of her estate for the purpose of creating an unrestricted endowment at the CFSEK. "She had many charitable uses in mind," said Bill Morin, Manley's estate attorney, "but she wasn't sure what charity she wanted to give to. That's when we started talking about the Community Foundation." Annual allocations from the endowed fund will be used to make grants in Manley's name during the CFSEK's annual competitive grant cycle.

"The CFSEK is honored and humbled to receive this gift from Mrs. Manley," said CFSEK Executive Director Kim Clark. "We are always pleased to help local citizens with their charitable goals, and gifts such as these allow the CFSEK to make an

impact on the changing needs of our citizens through strategic grant making."

The gift was a result of the Manley Estate that was managed by Commerce Trust Company, of Pittsburg, an affiliate of Commerce Bank N.A. "Because of Rosalie's caring concern for the welfare of her community, she is leaving this legacy that will benefit future generations and honor her memory for many years," said Gay Adams of Commerce Trust Company.

Manley was born in Pittsburg in 1928, and she graduated from Pittsburg High School in 1946. Rosalie was a member of the Telephone Pioneers Club serving as President and Past President, AARP, and Western Resources Retirees Club.
