It is easy to define the **year 2012** at the Foundation by one word - **generosity**. As you read this year in review please notice a quote about generosity threading throughout the review. For generosity makes the Foundation what it is: The generosity of our Board of Trustees, our Founders, our staff and YOU, our generous donors. "...it (**generosity**) **embraces the real needs of real people at the time it celebrates their individual humanity.**" Simply, we are reminded of the Foundation's major function—helping the needs of real people. We are a **connection** – we connect the donor to the needs in the community.

Our Foundation continues to grow, ending the year with 15 new funds and \$9.8 million in assets. We are recognized as a Regional Community Foundation and continue to facilitate funds that bring southeast Kansas entities together to building stronger communities. Giving is done person by person and community by community—all working together for the common good. This is community!

The awareness of our **two affiliates** grew in 2012. In **Fort Scott**, the Foundation extended their grant season to include a grant to the **Fort Scott General Transportation Program**. Residents in the Fort Scott area look to the General Transportation vehicles as their source of travel to medical appointments and other errands. In **Girard**, they funded their first grant to the **Girard Medical Center Foundation 'Campaign for Life'**. Both Foundations are **recipients of GROW II monies** provided by the Kansas Health Foundation.

FUND TYPES

WHEN THE FOUNDATION PARTNERS with a donor's attorney, CPA or financial advisor there are choices for how a fund can be established.



Donor Advised Funds are often created as an alternative to a private foundation and allow donors to recommend the charitable organizations and causes to be considered for grants.

Field-of-Interest Funds benefit specific areas such as education, youth, health, the arts, etc. that are of interest to the donor. They can also benefit a geographical area.

Unrestricted Funds give the Foundation the discretion to make grants that address the most urgent needs of the community as they change over time.

Designated Funds make grants to specific organizations chosen by the donor when the fund is established.

Scholarship Funds Donors may designate a particular school, field of study, select eligibility requirements, and name an advisory committee.

Agency Endowment Funds are created by other nonprofit organizations as a means of protecting their charitable dollars for the future and to ensure a source of annual support for their programs and operations.






