From time to time, the board of directors can see a need arise within the community that is not within our regular granting cycle guidelines. Community Foundation Hosts Community Conversations

As a part of the general grant cycle for 2011, the Community Foundation of Southeast Kansas hosted community conversations in each of the four counties that we serve. These conversations are a vehicle for the CFSEK to learn about the concerns of front line providers in the area.



CFSEK staff attended the local county coalition meetings to have an open dialog with providers who work with people in need of services every day. These providers are asked about what they feel are the needs of the specific county that they serve. Conversation topics can range from childhood obesity, assistance for the working poor, food scarcity, youth mentoring to poverty education. Staff and grant committee met to review the information and determine the areas of focus for 2011 general grant cycle. The focus areas for 2011 were determined to be basic human needs, poverty education and arts and culture (Pittsburg only). CFSEK looks forward to working with local non-profits to impact the needs of our region.

10 Years of Philanthropy in Southeast Kansas

On April 15, 2011 the Community Foundation of Southeast Kansas celebrated its ten year anniversary. The event was held at the home of Ken and Debbie Brock and was hosted by the Brocks as well as Ron and Barbara Rhodes and Steve and Chris Ward.

Over 130 attendees were on hand to celebrate the last ten years of philanthropy throughout Southeast Kansas. Current CFSEK Board of Trustee president, Joe Hart, began the evening by thanking and introducing the founders, ambassadors and current trustees. Lynda Wilkinson, past president and a founder of the CFSEK, spoke about the past ten years of the CFSEK and the impact it has made throughout the Southeast Kansas region. Wilkinson reminded all of the attendees about the gift that the community has received in the form of the Community Foundation of Southeast Kansas.

In the last ten years, the CFSEK has received over \$15 million and granted back out into the community over \$6.5 million. The CFSEK also manages two affiliates in the region, Fort Scott Area Community Foundation and the newly formed Girard Area Community Foundation. These regional affiliates allow individual communities in the area to build long term community capital of their own while receiving staff support from CFSEK.
