MATCH DAY 2019 RAISES OVER \$109,000!



On December 3rd, the Community Foundation of Southeast Kansas hosted its fourth annual Match Day. CFSEK holds Match Day every year to celebrate giving back to the community on "Giving Tuesday," a day dedicated to giving and philanthropy.

CFSEK is pleased to announce that the 2019 Match Day grand total is \$144,894! Community contributions raised \$109,894, and the Foundation gave an additional \$35,000 in match funds on a pro-rated percentage basis. The 24 participating non-profit organizations benefited by increasing their endowed funds, which will generate present and future income annually to address community needs.

Since the Community Foundation's first Match Day in 2016, the event has raised more than \$550,000 to support non-profit organizations that provide essential services and opportunities in our community.

"CFSEK was honored to host Match Day again this year," said Community Foundation Director Kit Parks. "Hundreds of community members gave to organizations that do so much for our community every day. Each donor and every donation is an important part of our campaign's success. We are grateful to everyone who supported this event on Giving Tuesday."

CFSEK GRANT CELEBRATION 2019

On Tuesday, November 12th, CFSEK hosted its annual Grant Celebration at the Wilkinson Alumni Center. More than 100 grant recipients, board members, and friends of CFSEK attended to celebrate the work of the nonprofit agencies that serve our community and its needs.

Attendees heard from representatives of seven featured organizations about how they put CFSEK grants to use improving the quality of life for SEK residents.

During 2019, 93 grants totaling \$208,000 were given from CFSEK's general grant funds, the Rita J. Bicknell Women's Health Fund giving circles, the Future Fund Giving Circle, the Get Busy Livin' Foundation, and the Elm Acres Foundation. The Foundation holds annual grant cycles that accept applications from non-profits, government entities, educational institutions, and religious organizations across the SEK region.

SPEAKER OFFERS LESSONS FOR WOMEN IN PHILANTHROPY



CFSEK offered a training specifically for women interested in philanthropy. Empowering Women was the focus of a Lunch & Learn on September 26. Sandi Fruit traveled to Pittsburg from central Kansas to talk to women from our SEK communities about money, managing it, and using it to build a family legacy. A small group of women gathered to hear about the unique role women have in retirement, what it means to be part of a sandwich generation, and stories about Kansas women who have impacted their own communities.

Sandi shared her knowledge from 25+ years of experience in non-profit management, planned giving, marketing, and public relations in higher education and healthcare. Sandi retired as the Executive Director of the Central Kansas Community Foundation in 2014. She continues to be a champion for community foundations across Kansas.

Throughout the year, CFSEK offers educational opportunities as a service to the community. Empowering Women was the third community service provided this year. A grant writing training was offered in collaboration with Kansas State University Research & Extension in April. Every June, an estate planning continuing education training is offered to area professional advisors. CFSEK enjoys being able to provide these needed opportunities to the community as another way of carrying out our mission.

YEAR-END GIVING STRATEGIES YOU SHOULD KNOW

The end of 2019 is fast approaching, and that means many area residents are thinking about saving money on taxes. For many, reducing their annual tax burden through charitable giving has become a little trickier in recent years thanks to changes in federal tax laws. Those changes include an increase in the standard deduction, shrinking the number of Americans who can itemize.



Fortunately, legal and tax professionals can help taxpayers use creative giving strategies to continue taking advantage of the charitable deduction, such as:

- **Bunching multiple years' donations into a single year.** By combining bunching with a donor-advised fund, a donor can claim a tax deduction in the current year and still remain involved in distributing the funds to nonprofits in subsequent years.
- Charitable rollovers from an IRA. Individuals who must take a required minimum distribution from a tax-deferred IRA can offset the taxable amount of the RMD up to \$100,000 by making a non-taxable qualified charitable distribution. (This benefit is not available for distributions to a donor-advised fund.)
