

<u>Community Foundation of Southeast Kansas Completes Goal</u>



The Community Foundation of Southeast Kansas celebrated Christmas early. The Kansas Health Foundation challenge of raising \$700,000 endowed dollars by the end of 2006 has been completed. Chris Ward made the announcement to foundation trustees at the November 20, board meeting. "The Kansas Health Foundation has been instrumental to the success of our foundation. By completing this challenge, Kansas Health Foundation has agreed to match, dollar for dollar, the \$700,000 raised locally. The KHF challenge dollars will be placed in the KHF Endowed Children's Fund, which we administer. Grants from this fund are made to local agencies each fall, explained Ward."

Trustees were quick to point out that the success of meeting this challenge reflects positively on donors in Southeast Kansas. Agencies and individual donors that contributed to CFSEK endowments believe in the future of Southeast Kansas. Endowment funds invest the principal and use the returns on investments to make charitable grants.

CFSEK has participated in the Kansas Health Foundation GROW initiatives since 2001. The GROW (Giving Resources to Our World) Healthy Kansas Initiative is a partnership between the Kansas Health Foundation and a select group of community foundations throughout the state of Kansas. The Kansas Health Foundation believes that Kansas community foundations build and strengthen their communities.

Foundation Receives Grant from Kansas Health Foundation

CFSEK recently received a 3 year-\$300,000 grant from the Kansas Health Foundation to improve nutrition and physical activity awareness in the southeast Kansas area. Local awareness efforts will combine with the state-wide public motivation campaign, "change something", that was launched by KHF in early September. According to Marni Vliet, president & CEO of KHF, "The 'change something' campaign serves as a reminder that opportunities exist all around us to be more physically active and incorporate healthier eating habits. Simple, daily changes add up to healthier lifestyles and improve the health outlook for Kansans."

A public mall walk kick-off event for the local "change something" campaign will be held on Monday, January 1, 2007, at Meadowbrook Mall from 1-3 p.m. Additionally, the CFSEK will be conducting a county-wide listening tour as a means of engaging county citizens in conversations concerning the areas of nutrition and physical activity. <u>FUTURE FUND MAKES FIRST GRANT</u>

The 2006 Future Fund group met November 3, 2006 at Bricktown for their annual fall business meeting. It was announced that the endowment fund has a balance of just over \$45,000. The group noted that the fund was well on its way to the 5 year-\$100,000 goal set in its first year.

The Future Fund grant committee presented 3 grant candidates for review. Those in attendance voted to grant \$1,100.00 to the Women's Resource Center to be used for additional parenting curriculum. This grant marked the first gift to the community from the Future Fund. The group will continue to make grants on a yearly basis at its fall business meeting.

Many thanks to the donors who helped make our goal of reaching \$700,000. Your generosity has helped us meet our current goal so future generations will benefit. Now, the CFSEK will receive \$700,000 as a match from the Kansas Health Foundation which will be placed in our KHF Children's Fund. This fund will soon contain over 1 million dollars!!! NEW! Charitable IRA Rollover

If you are age 70-1/2 or older, new legislation now allows you to make cash gifts totaling \$100,000 per year from your traditional or Roth IRA to qualified charities without incurring income tax on the withdrawal. On August 17th President Bush signed H.R. 4, the Pension Protection Act of 2006, into law. This bill contains a two-year IRA Charitable Rollover provision that allows people over 70-1/2 or older to exclude up to \$100,000 from their gross income in tax years 2006 and 2007 for cash gifts made directly to a qualified charity. This is good news for people who want to make a charitable gift during their lifetime from their retirement assets, but have been discouraged from doing so because of the income tax penalty. The following is a list of our affiliated funds that would qualify for an IRA rollover gift. Contact the CFSEK for details.
