COMMUNITY FOUNDATION LEGACY SOCIETY

The Community Foundation Legacy Society was created to thank and recognize individuals who want to make a lasting contribution to their community through estate, trust and long-term gifts to the Community Foundation of Southeast Kansas. Membership in the society is simple: notify us that you have made or intend to make a planned gift to the Foundation or to any of our existing funds. Deferred gifts may be designated for deposit into any of the existing funds of the Foundation, or for the establishment of a new fund of the donor's choice. A new fund requires a \$10,000 pledge.

Anyone who returns our planned giving pledge notifying us of their intended gift to the Pittsburg Area Community Foundation prior to December 31,2006, will receive a certificate designating him or her as a Charter Member of the Community Foundation Legacy Society and will be permanently recognized as a Charter Member in our Annual Report. In addition, members will receive recognition at events and their name engraved on our Legacy plaque.
